

Short curriculum

Sforza got her degree in Mathematics at the University of Bari in 1982. In 1983 she won a four-year fellowship to attend the courses of Dottorato di Ricerca in Matematica at the University of Pisa. In 1988 she became Dottore di Ricerca in Matematica with a thesis written under the supervision of prof. Giuseppe Da Prato (Scuola Normale Superiore Pisa). In the years 87-88, 88-89, 89-90 she won three annual fellowships of the Istituto Nazionale di Alta Matematica (INdAM) to continue her research under the supervision of prof. Da Prato.

In 1990 she became Researcher at the University of Pisa. Since 1992 she is Associate Professor at Sapienza University of Rome, where she delivers undergraduate courses of Mathematical Analysis to students of the Faculty of Engineering.

Sforza was invited speaker at international conferences. She participated in the organization of international conferences. In 2006 she visited the University of Metz, as invited professor.

Sforza's scientific interests include partial differential equations and control theory. Her current research is mainly concerned with stabilization and control of evolution equations.

She currently collaborates as peer reviewer with several international mathematical journals.
